

KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE STUDY VISIT: ROMANIAN NATIONAL RURAL NETWORK AND SPANISH CAP NETWORK

Date and time: Monday, 10th of march- 09:30 - 14:15 h - Ministry, Madrid.

From Tuesday 11th march to Friday 14th march - Project visits.

Modality: In-person meeting.

Place: Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food. Pº Infanta Isabel, 1 28014 Madrid, Spain.

Context

The Article 126 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115, concerning national and European CAP networks, states that national CAP networks “**shall build on existing practices and experience in networking activities in the Member states**” and that the European CAP network is established by the Commission “**for collaboration between national networks, organisations and administrations in the field of agriculture and rural development at Union level.**”

It also states that the objectives of **collaboration** through national and European CAP networks include “**fostering innovation in agriculture and rural development and supporting peer learning and the inclusion of all stakeholders in the process of knowledge exchange and knowledge building, as well as interaction between them.**”

To achieve these objectives, the tasks of the networks include “**contributing to capacity building of Member state administrations and other actors involved in the implementation of the CAP strategic plans**”; the “**creation of platforms, forums and events to facilitate the exchange of experiences between stakeholders and peer learning, including exchanges with networks in third countries**”; “**support for cooperation projects, ..., including transnational cooperation**”; and “**the creation of links to other strategies or networks funded by the Union.**”

Also, in the case of the national CAP networks, the tasks include “**participation in the activities of the European CAP network and contribution to these activities.**”

Regarding this last task, the national networks participate in activities of the European CAP Network and in this sense, the Spanish CAP Network actively collaborates in European events and work in clusters such as the Mediterranean cluster, together with the Romanian network, as well as in thematic clusters, such as the antennae and communication clusters, which are led by the Spanish network or the youth clusters in which it also takes an active part.

Objectives of the day

The general objective of the conference is to exchange knowledge between the national networks. For this purpose, the following specific objectives have been established:

- ✓ Exchange knowledge and experience regarding the activities undertaken by the Romanian and the Spanish CAP network.
- ✓ To know other units involved in the implementation of the Strategic Plan with the aim of serving as a reference and inspiration for the networks involved, as LEADER, evaluation and eco-schemes.
- ✓ Visit successful Spanish EAFRD projects in Andalucia and Castilla La Mancha regions.

Organic farm	Unnamed Road, 45687, Alcañizo, Toledo https://maps.app.goo.gl/2pC5zeGwEpTMGLxE7	--	An agricultural and livestock farm of almost 300 hectares certified organic, located in the Toledo region of Oropesa. The livestock part is devoted to Avilanian breed cows crossed with Limousins and pure Avilanian oxen, Talavera breed sheep, broiler chickens and slow-growing hairless-necked capons, and laying hens. As for agriculture, they have 80 hectares of crops, dedicated to orchards and greenhouses, stone fruit trees, meadows, and reforestation of native trees. In addition, they have a workshop, a meat cutting room, and a warehouse for logistics and basket assembly.
